September 2024, witnessed ten MoU announcements, partnership declarations and deal signings including:

- 1. €25 million in grants from the European Union to support the Namibian Green Industrialisation Agenda. The initiative, which includes commitments from Germany and the Netherlands, will be channelled via the SDG Namibia One financing vehicle for green hydrogen investment in Namibia including technical assistance to support long-term energy planning, renewable energy generation, and grid integration in collaboration with key Namibian stakeholders including the Namibian Green Hydrogen Programme (NGH2P) and Namibian Standards Institute (NSI).
- 2. Zhero announced the launch of a green ammonia gigawatt-scale project in Namibia, aiming to produce 500,000 tonnes annually from 2029 with Chinese codevelopers, Envision Energy.
- 3. GreenGo Energy sign an MoU with local Namibian developer InnoSun Energy Holdings to co-develop solar and wind projects dedicated to green hydrogen production at scale.
- 4. GreenGo Energy announce the signing of a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with local Namibian iron mining company, Lodestone. This collaboration will explore innovative solutions to integrate green hydrogen into the steel production process.

## LÜDERITZ PROPERTY SHOOTS UP BY 30% IN ONE YEAR

Lüderitz mayor Phil Balhao says residential property prices at the town have increased by 30% to 50% over the past year.

The discovery of 11 billion barrels of offshore oil in the Orange Basin has positioned Lüderitz and Oranjemund as potential hotspots for an oil and gas boom. However, the discoveries could also have a downside: a surge in housing and property prices.

What is happening at Lüderitz is consistent with similar developments in other 'oil towns' worldwide.

Wealthy individuals and foreign investors, who have no need for Namibian bank loans, snap up properties with 'loose' cash. Residents, including the poor, are then stuck with higher rental prices as the cost of land increases. This pushes the poor, who live in the locations and squatter settlements north and east of the centre of Lüderitz, into ever more difficult circumstances. Rising land prices can even force low-income residents to move out of Lüderitz altogether.

Balhao told stated that he was not surprised about the property market boom.

The mayor further said the municipality has approached the government to expand the town's boundaries.

The Summit unlocked the potential of the hydrogen opportunity in Africa and harnessed its projected impact on achieving a sustainable and equitable energy transition global. James Mnyupe, presidential economic advisor and head of programme, Namibia Green Hydrogen Programme (NGH2P) summarised that "the Summit was a huge success and will come back to Namibia next year from 9 – 11 September, 2025."

"Only an increase in the supply of land around Lüderitz can alleviate the situation", he said.

Balhao said Sperrgebiet Diamond Mining has taken over the mining lease around Lüderitz from Namdeb, and has been negotiating for an expansion.

## **NHE HOUSING BACKLOG HITS 120 000**

More than 120 000 people are on the National Housing Enterprise's waiting list. National Housing Enterprises (NHE) chief executive officer Gisbertus Mukulu revealed this at an information-sharing session in Windhoek on 6 August 2024.

He said the overall housing backlog in the country remains steady at 300 000, which makes the provision of housing a "mammoth" task.

"The housing backlog is mostly in the ultra-low and low-income segments of the Namibian population," Mukulu said. He said to try and remedy the situation, the NHE has come up with deliberate interventions, of which one is to build houses that are more affordable.

This includes designing houses without pricey finishes such as ceiling boards, tiles and geysers.

"This is because the majority of Namibians are not able to afford a house that is too expensive. Clients can then expand their house as soon as their financial situation has improved", he said. Mukulu said the NHE sets cheap prices for their houses because it has the mandate to provide houses to low, ultra-low and medium-income earners.

The NHE has one to three bedroom houses, which can range from between N\$80 000 and N\$200 000 per house. Mukulu said the NHE has launched a five-year strategic plan which kicked off this year.

The plan aims to increase the firm's loan book, and improve its service delivery.

## CENTRAL BANK CUTS REPO RATE TO 7.5% TO SUPPORT ECONOMY AND MAINTAIN **CURRENCY PEG**

From 12-13 August 2024, the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) of the Bank of Namibia held its fourth bi-monthly meeting for 2024 to decide on the appropriate monetary policy stance to be implemented over the next two months. To supporting the domestic economy simultaneously safeguarding the peg between the Namibia Dollar and the South African Rand, the MPC decided to reduce the Repo rate by 25 basis points to 7.50 percent. This decision was made following a comprehensive review of domestic, regional and global economic developments.

The domestic economic recovery continued during the first six months of 2024, although growth is forecast to decelerate for 2024 as a whole. Inflation continued to be moderate, while the growth in Private Sector Credit Extension (PSCE) remains subdued. The merchandise trade deficit widened further while the stock of international reserves remained sufficient to support the currency peg and meet the country's international financial obligations.

Global economic activity continued on a gradual expansion path during the second quarter of 2024, with growth expected to remain broadly stable in 2024 and 2025. While inflation recently exhibited a mixed picture, it is significantly lower than a year earlier. The monetary policy easing cycle has commenced even though most monitored central banks continued to exercise caution regarding interest rate reductions

The MPC observed that despite the gradual global disinflation, most monitored central banks have remained restrictive even though some have taken the first step in easing monetary policy. In Namibia, economic activity remained on a recovery path but with a lower growth rate forecast for 2024, in part due to drought-induced setbacks. There has been a welcome slowdown in inflation. Private sector credit extension has been weak for a protracted period and the domestic economy, in aggregate, was also deemed in need of essential support. With inflation and inflation expectations slowing and nominal interest 5 Public rates unchanged, real interest rates have increased thereby signalling an effective tightening of monetary policy. International reserves remain adequate and have in fact increased further. Considering these factors, the MPC felt that a moderate easing of monetary policy was warranted.

## DUNDEE, CHINESE FIRM MARRIAGE APPROVED

The Namibian Competition Commission (NaCC) has approved the proposed merger between Hong Kongbased Sinomine Rare Metals Resources Co. Limited and Dundee Precious Metals (DPM) Tsumeb Holding (Pty) Limited, with conditions.

Sinomine Resource Group recently concluded deals to purchase controlling interests in a copper mine in Zambia, and earlier this year purchased Dundee's copper smelter in Namibia.

The NaCC approved the merger on condition there shall be no retrenchment of Namibian employees three years after concluding the deal. Also, the parties must maintain a ratio of no less than 92% local employees.

## IZA AFRICA LAUNCHES LATEST EDITION OF ITS 'EXPERT GUIDE TO GALVANIZING'

The International Zinc Association (IZA) Africa has launched its May 2024 'Expert Guide to Galvanizing'. "No engineer in the civil engineering, mining, design or structural engineering sector or architect should be without a copy", comments IZA Africa Director Simon Norton.

Galvanizing with zinc ensures that steel receives long-term protection from corrosion. Design, fabrication, and inspection requirements are an essential part of any project that involves successful hot dip galvanizing.

The 'Expert Guide to Galvanizing' has been compiled by IZA Africa with the assistance of Terry Smith, an independent expert consultant in galvanizing. Norton originally conceptualised and produced the first IZA A publication, 'The Essentials of Galvanizing', in 2020 with input from Smith.

Now they have collaborated again to create and compile latest edition

of 'The Expert Guide to Galvanizing' to ensure engineers and specifiers have an advanced understanding of zinc-based coatings at their fingertips.

Hot dip galvanizing of steelwork with zinc has been integral to steel structures for many years, while the techniques and understanding of galvanizing has advanced significantly as well. Galvanizing protects steel in two unique ways: Firstly, as a slowly corroding barrier offering a reliable and long lifespan to the steel; and, secondly, should the coating be damaged, the surrounding zinc will sacrifice itself by providing cathodic protection.

In order to obtain the maximum benefit, the Expert Guide should be read in conjunction with 'The Essentials of Galvanizing' published in 2021.


